They are also starting to see issues with the other pump. He would like to purchase a third pump to have a spare. Commissioners Cameron and Crooks agreed.

Commissioner Cameron and Commissioner Crooks talked to Chris from the Times Recorder regarding the Animal Shelter and the Dog Pound. Commissioner Cameron said that she would love to talk with the new director and the board to see if they can work with them on housing some of the dogs from the pound. The Animal Shelter board president said they are too busy right now to meet. The Prosecutor's office said they can work up an agreement with the Shelter, if they would agree to it. All 3 Commissioners, the director, the board members and the 3 dog wardens need to join forces for the good of the dogs. Chris said he will call the Shelter to see if they would be willing to talk to the Commissioners and try to work together. He said the public is passionate about animals.

Chris asked about the budget. Commissioner Cameron said it will be discussed during the session on Monday. Commissioner Crooks said they have met with several of the elected officials to discuss their budget and a lot of the leg work is already completed. Commissioner Cameron said they hope to finish budget Monday for final review. Commissioner Cameron said Chris Hamill and the Investment Committee has made great decisions in investments and interest is up. Commissioner Crooks said Chris made \$135,000 in investments in December and has collected a lot of revenue from delinquent taxes for the county.
