Scott Lee, Facilities Superintendent, came to discuss his 2021 budget.

- Items added to this year's budget
  - o Freight Elevator at the Hixson Building
  - o Air Conditioner in Computer Network Room
  - Water Tower at Child Support
- Has figured 3% salary increases
  - o Estimates overtime, never know for sure
- Looking at future for updates to Courthouse elevator

The Commissioners had a phone call with Cindy Rodgers, Recorder, regarding her 2021 budget.

- She's budgets a 5% in her salary line item, but follows the Commissioners' recommendation for percentage increase for individual staff
  - When she figures a larger increase, that allows for shortages in insurance, PERS, etc
- She will be replacing an employee sometime this year, probably when COVID subsides
- Office Update:
  - o 1508 additional recordings than 2019
  - o Additional \$164,811.80 than 2019
  - o E-recordings at 17.85%
  - Military discharges
    - Less recorded and fewer cards issued in 2020
  - o Purchased a new phone system in 2020

Corrie Marple, Records Manager, came to talk with the Commissioners regarding a discrepancy with RDT invoice and the amount agreed upon.

- Commissioners approved and purchase order opened for \$173,415
- Invoice for \$194,019
- Corrie is to coordinate a virtual meeting with RDT

Commissioner Porter asked how much COVID money is left in the General Fund.

- A call was placed to Mike Babcock
- On December 29, \$964,327.04 was put in the General Fund
  - o No longer COVID money, but we are to track, Auditor is not
- Perry Township Fire Department has asked if the County could help in the replacing of a heater for their filter system
  - 0 \$9,000+
- Also, with an extraction machine
  - o \$12,000+
- It is Commissioner Porter's belief that if we can give \$10,000 to businesses who never shut their doors, he would like for the Board to come up with a way to support Perry Fire Department
- Jeff Jadwin said there could be some additional COVID money that may be available through a program to apply for the extraction machine
- Some squads took advantage of the COVID money through their Townships
- Commissioner Porter would like to propose some type of funding for each Fire Department
  - Directly to the Fire Departments from the Commissioners; not through EMA
    - Same amount to each Department
    - Commissioner Crooks would like to see lists of costs and how related/affected by COVID
  - There are 14 Fire Squads in Muskingum County, not including Zanesville City
  - Commissioner Crooks sent an email to the Assistant Prosecutor for guidance in how to handle this money now that it is General Fund monies.
  - Commissioner Porter would not be in favor of eliminating the Department if they previously received CARES money

Commissioner Porter reported that he received another text from Mr. Hill regarding the Zanesville Historical Apartments, giving him an update on their housing situation.

- Commissioner Cameron reported that the Mayor said that anyone living there legally, would be housed in an apartment on SR40 West and would have the chance to move back or stay in the apartment, after renovations completed
- Commissioner Cameron gave Commissioner Porter Ann Hollingsworth' phone number. She may be able to help.

Commissioner Porter brought the Board's attention to HB665 regarding County Fairs.

- It states that the Fair is to not have more debt than income for the last three fairs
- If Agricultural Society does not hold fair, the Commissioners' Board is not required to pay any contributions

There was discussion regarding an email from Jamie McConnell, 4-H Educator, asking for the Commissioners to participate in a 4-H video.

- All agreed to do it together
  - o Due February 12

Commissioner Crooks reported that a Volunteer at the Dog Warden Facility asked about gravel for the driveway.

• Maintenance took care of it

The Commissioners adjourned for lunch to resume session at 1:30 p.m.

Commissioner Porter reported that there are 14 Muskingum County Fire Departments.

- Wouldn't be interested in Zanesville City
  - o The City received their own COVID money that they could have given their City Fire Departments

The Commissioners worked on the 2021 General Fund Budget.

There was continued discussion regarding funding of Fire Departments with the remaining COVID funds now in County General, following the guidelines, for safety expenses.

- Commissioner Porter would like to be able to give Perry Township an answer at their meeting tonight
- Commissioner Porter proposed that the Departments submit their proof of need up to \$20,000.
- Commissioner Cameron asked if Perry Fire Department requested COVID money from their Township when made available
- Commissioners Cameron and Crooks agreed that the Board should follow legal council's opinion
  - o The Board has not heard back from Mark Zanghi at this point of the day.
- Commissioner Cameron said she would be in favor if it can be done legally
- Commissioner Cameron said that if Perry Township returned COVID money, the County has it

A call was placed to Mark Zanghi, Assistant Prosecutor. He had just left the office and said he would follow up tomorrow.

There was continued discussion.

With no further business being before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at approximately 4:27 p.m. on the motion of Commissioner Porter and the second of Commissioner Cameron.
