- About eight employees are needed to fill the crew openings

There was discussion about how the money and tickets would be collected this year and who would be collecting it now that Captain's wife, Becky, has resigned as the hostess for the Lorena

- Commissioner Crooks suggested the possibility of sharing a crew with Pae Ohana
- Commissioner Cameron would think Captain Page would have to be involved in the hiring of an Assistant Captain
- Commissioner Crooks thinks we need someone in the event that Captain Page cannot man the vessel, for whatever reason; why not have more than one
- The current captain-in-training has been paid as a crew member

Scott Lee was called in to session.

- Scott was asked about James Electric for the Courthouse fire alarm system
 - o He is supposed to be working on a quote
- Scott was told that the hole in the parking lot should be fixed this week
- Scott was asked if the Maintenance Department could handle the maintenance, including painting, on the Lorena
 - o Yes, they used to always do it

Scott reported that the jail should be back to 100% this week.

Jeremy Davis and Roger Touvell are working together drawing and putting together specs on the Health Department HVAC.

Commissioner Crooks asked about the Courthouse Elevator.

- Scott said we have estimates and the ball is in our court now
 - o Should we have two?

Would the repairs of the parking lot qualify for CDBG grant monies?
