 - Pat is looking into the lock-by-key option for the bedroom windows

- Must be cautious to not void warranty of the windows
- Also, none of the bedroom windows are tempered glass
 - Pat said they are not required by code, nor were they requested
 - Gary assumed tempered glass would be installed, especially in the bedrooms, due to safety concerns
 - Pat said they could buy new sashes or the entire window
 - Prices for the boys and girls bedroom windows are as
 - o \$27,208 sashes only
 - o \$23,808 new windows
 - G & M has offered to replace the sashes in the existing windows
 - o The left over frames from the newly purchased windows could be stored for parts
 - Commissioner Cameron asked if that would affect the warranty
 - o That will be addressed
 - All agreed to the window locks and tempered glass
 - Eric will verify with Gary that tempered glass is requested only in the bedrooms
 - Eric will ask if Avondale is willing to store the new windows
- o Eric reported that Pat is still working on the HVAC
 - Could potentially require electrical upgrades

- The results of the WSRLA grant funding was released and the County was granted \$445,000 100% Principal Forgiveness, for the engineering of the project. We did not receive the \$7 million requested for the construction of the project. Mostly, because they determined the project was not able to be constructed in 2023. We've been advised to apply again for next year's funding.
- Don asked the Board if they wanted to use the \$445,000 for Maysville Water Extension engineering or to put towards another project
 - o All agreed to use for Maysville Water Extension Project

Andy Roberts, GIS Director and Matt Abbott, Port Authority Director came to present Land Use RFQ results to the Commissioners.

Commissioner Crooks reported that Mike Maniaci had reached out to her regarding Shala Circle

- He is frustrated with the Commissioners' and Engineer's decision regarding the right-ofway
- Commissioner Crooks called Engineer Mark Eicher
 - Mark explained that the County owns the right-of-way and the Township owns the property
 - Mark said he would be willing to come back in and sit down with everyone again.
 Commissioner Crooks suggested that perhaps the property owner would like to come in to discuss with the Engineer
 - Mike will reach out to the property owner
