Motion carried.

Commissioners discussed an email from Brian Summers regarding a problem with a creek off Creamery Road near Vista View.

- Mike Maniaci, Township Trustee, talked with one land owner that is willing to help with clean up, the township will look at the project as a way to take care of the road
- Will the Commissioners be willing to help with the \$10,000.00 expense?
- Commissioner Crooks will advise him to talk to the County Engineer

Commissioner Crooks said that Theresa Hildebrand from PAWS and Carolyn Hughes, Humane Officer, said they are overwhelmed with call about cats.

- Theresa and Carolyn are receiving calls from Hospice, Home Health Agencies, and Sheriff's department to deal with cats. One call from Hospice was requesting they pick up 60 cats from a home in Dresden
- Over the years, we (the Commissioners) have received multiple calls from residents about feral cats in neighborhoods, businesses and individual homes.
- The law may not give responsibility to any entity to deal with this...but when is it just the right thing to do?
- Asked if the Commissioners would be willing to let them use the old dog pound to euthanize cats
- Dr. Reid is willing to help
- Commissioner Porter has concerns about insurance liability, cleanup, utilities. Not willing to use tax payer dollars for that
- Commissioner Cameron asked why doesn't the Animal Shelter take care of the cats? According to the ORC, the County is responsible for the dogs

Robbie Frame came in to discuss the meeting at the Adoption Center.

- Tom from Flecto and a representative from the epoxy company were also at the Adoption Center meeting
- Damage to flooring and some water damage were discussed
- Epoxy company has not been fully paid yet, because the job has not been correct from the beginning
- Flecto said he thought it should have been taken care of before, but he will take care of it

Commissioner Cameron said Jeff Jadwin is having problems with groundhogs again and Don Hunter, the Trapper, said he would be there the 11th or 12th.

• Agreed for Jeff to contact Don Hunter as needed

Robbie reported on the Rural Services Building.

- New security light installed, trash outside of building picked up, alley has been weed eated
- Commissioner Porter said the carpet needs replaced throughout the building
- Commissioner Cameron said they are County buildings and we should take care of them
- Commissioner Porter will report to Rural Services that the problems are being addressed
- Commissioner Porter said FSA and Soil & Water work in conjunction with each other and he would like to keep both of them as tenants

Commissioner Crooks asked Robbie if the elevator could get updated.

Commissioner Crooks reported that the jail feasibility study timeline is still in process.

Commissioner Crooks said the volunteers at the Adoption Center have asked about the stainless steel doors and glass panels

• Cost would be \$255,000 if done at the same time

- Eric will make contact with companies that do environmental reviews to get quotes and to get the process started

Center for Seniors

- Eric passed out report from their first meeting on April 22,2022
- They are asking for support for software, vehicles and cost of meals
- Eric said they had a quote for 3 vehicles

- County cash balance as of 07.07.2022 is \$13.8 million

Commissioner Crooks mentioned that Teresa Hildebrand, PAWS, wanted to know if the County could give support in order to get match from 2 grants.

• Teresa had asked for \$2,500 from the City and \$2,500 from the County in order to get match of \$5,000 from grants

Commissioner Crooks made motion to provide \$2,500 to PAWS for Spay and Neuter program, no Second.

Motion failed.
