Peggy told her have been behind and when a lessor calls for the balance of a lessee's water bill, it doesn't always show as delinquent because the latest bill may not be accounted for yet. This happens sometimes because the lessee has 30 days to pay that bill. However, if the lessee does not pay that bill, then the lessor is left with the bill. The Utilities Department has now begun to mail final billing every two weeks, which Don thinks may help that situation.

Pam reported that last Friday she interviewed four applicants for the Assistant Cook position for the Center for Seniors. She would propose the following:

- Many years ago, their debt was rolled into County debt when refinancing through bond to combine
- Mark asked if there is an actual note signed by the Fair Board acknowledging the debt
- It must first be determined who is responsible for what in the future
 - o If the Commissioners expect to receive payments from the Fair Board, the terms need to be set in writing
- The debt could be refinanced
- Or the debt could be forgiven
 - o Either way a resolution should be put in place confirming intention
- Mark needs as much documentation as is available and the Board's decision on how to proceed
 - o Mark will then prepare a draft resolution
 - o Commissioner Porter found much of the previous documentation

Commissioner Crooks moved to approve the minutes of the July 30, 2020 session with change. Commissioner Porter seconded.
