Jeff also found out that we no longer have an AT&T representative for the County, which most likely explains the lack of communication. Jeff and Beth both contacted PUCO regarding this issue. PUCO assured them that the accounts would not be suspended while the issue is being resolved. At the Commissioners' request, Jeff will arrange a meeting with AT&T.

Allen Bennett and Robert Smith from Juvenile Detention, came to talk with the Commissioners.

- Phone System
  - o They've been told that their system is suffering voltage surges and they need a new system
  - o Robert has paid ABI \$12,900 to order parts to replace hardware
  - o An additional \$16,500 will be needed to replace the phones
- Security System
  - The current system is 22 years old and vendor no longer services this system
  - o They will be applying for a DYS grant that will cover 60% of the project requiring 40% match
  - o The cost of the new system will be \$40 \$60,000
  - o Will a bid be required or considered an upgrade?

- Dr. Gandolf is currently working as a traveling surgical veterinarian, but would like to establish a brick and mortar because she recognizes the need of homeless animals and animals of owners that cannot always afford extensive care.
- She, along with Susan Holdren, is asking if the County may have a building that she could use or rent for this purpose. She would like a minimum of 1800 square feet, 3,000 sf would be ideal.
  - o They have looked at the old Dog Pound, as a possibility, and estimates nearly \$500,000 to make usable
- Dr. Gandolf currently visits our Adoption Center once every one to two weeks
- Dr. Gandolf suggests that the best way to deal with the overwhelming feral cat problem is to trap, neuter and release (TNR). She believes shelters are only one part of the solution.

The Commissioners suggested revisiting the old Dog Pound and getting actual estimates for renovations.

Sheriff Lutz came to update the Commissioners.

- Flecto will be coming September 11 to install the final group of new kennels
- They are still dealing with moisture/humidity in the facility which is causing mold
  - o Sheriff will be looking for equipment to remedy that situation
