 Commissioner Cameron said that Sheriff Lutz would like to send a deputy to check the premises at the 224 Columbia St. property before maintenance does the boarding up, weed eating and draining the pool

Kyle Dunn, CDBG Manager, came in to discuss the PY 2022 CHIP program.

Andy Roberts, Planning Commission Director, came to session to discuss his 2023 Budget

- Would like to hire an Assistant Director of Planning and Land Reutilization
- Discussed current Planning Commission fees and would like to increase the fee rates

The following legislation was now considered:

RESOLUTION 22-1064 Whereas; the Muskingum County Land Reutilization Corp (MCLRC) has secured funding from the State of Ohio Brownfield Remediation and Demolition & Site Revitalization Programs for the demolition and remediation of the former Mosaic Tile Factory and the former Munson School,

And Whereas; the state of Ohio has informed the MCLRC that their funding shall be on a reimbursable basis,

And Whereas; the MCLRC does not have sufficient cash holdings to fully pay the upfront costs, And Whereas; the MCLRC has requested the Board of County Commissioners to advance to them an amount not to exceed \$200,000.00 per incurrence, to be reimbursed to the Board of County Commissioners as soon as funds are reimbursed from the State of Ohio,

And Whereas; the MCLRC will be in need of such advances until July of 2023, and that it is in the general public interest to bring these projects to completion,

Therefore, be it resolved that this Board of Muskingum County Commissioners does hereby authorize the advance of an amount not to exceed \$200,000.00 to the MCLRC for funding of the Mosaic Tile and Munson School demolition and remediation on a reoccurring basis until July 30th, 2023. Repayment by the MCLRC of each tranche shall be made in the amount advanced upon the reimbursement from the State of Ohio.

Mark Zanghi, Assistant Prosecutor came to session.

• Discussed the email and survey he received from the Commissioners from Ohio Public Defenders. They are suggesting the State Department process the Indigent Appointed Counsel forms. This would take it out of the County hands and put it into the States hands. The judges agreed for the County to continue running the indigent cases.

Larry Daniels, Veterans Supervisor, came to present the proposed 2023 Veterans Budget.

Clifton Martin, OSU Extension, came to present the proposed 2023 OSU Budget.

Commissioner Crooks discussed an email from Curtis Hall. He has concerns regarding the condition of the township road he lives on. His residence is in Meigs Township near The Wilds.

Discussion on a request to rename Fletcher Rd to Mary Rose Ln. The family of Martin Smith has requested this change. Mark Eicher, Engineer, will be contacted.

Eric Reed brought in a Resolution from the Water Department

The following legislation was now considered:

Scott Lee came in at the Commissioners request. Commissioner Crooks told him that a Nativity Scene has been donated to the County. Arrangements will be made to pick it up.

Commissioner Cameron said that Judge Kalis called and had some questions regarding the parking lot behind the Hixson Building. Scott will get in touch with her.

Scott Lee asked about the Commissioner dedicated signage that Commissioner Porter wanted for the Board of Elections, Center for Seniors and for the K-9 Adoption Center.

- Commissioner Cameron said that Commissioner Porter was to check on prices from several local businesses
- Scott has checked on some pricing

Commissioner Crooks asked if Robert Moore, I.T., has heard any more about the Courthouse light replacements and getting a lift to reach the 3rd floor.

- Commissioner Cameron said he told her it would take around 5 weeks to get them, but there could be a quicker way to get them
- Commissioner Cameron said Robert will check on the shipment timing

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Further discussion on the renaming of Fletcher Rd to Mary Rose Ln. Martin Smith is the only resident on that portion of road. There were further phone conversations with Mark Eicher.

With no further business being before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at approximately 4:08 p.m. on the motion of Commissioner Cameron and the second of Commissioner Crooks.
