Commissioner Porter said he spoke to Mike Reiter, Solid Waste Management, regarding ideas on doing something for Rob Reiter retirement.

The Commissioner reviewed an email from Guernsey County Commissioners regarding S.B.52 (Solar and Wind Facilities).

• Commissioner Porter said he is in favor of banning solar panels and wind mills, because they are taking up precious farmland that will not be reclaimed back to usable ground.

Stan Lucas, Sewer Supervisor, came to session.

• Stan wanted to come in and clarify something he saw in the minutes, "where Jim you said the highway department fixed a mess that the sewer department left in Sonora. That's not a true statement. His guys, the sewer department, did all the milling of the pavement, they jack-hammered out the concrete, put the riser in there and the highway department paved it. And that was the only reason he needed the highway department's help, was because the sewer department doesn't do paving". Commissioner Porter said, "it's fixed now and it's a lot better than it was". Stan didn't appreciate the comment that was made that made his guys look bad and that they weren't doing their job. Commissioner Porter said his guys were the ones working on it when he saw it. Stan said they absolutely were, and he didn't feel like that comment should have been made. Commissioner Porter said, well, I made it. Stan said I know, but I just wanted to clarify, that's not the case, they did their job well. Commissioner Porter said, "I disagree with you". Stan said, ok. Commissioner Crooks thanked Stan for the clarification as he was leaving.
