- Mark reported that International Drive is becoming wash-boardy because of the extra traffic and contractors for SR146 using the road
  - Mark talked with ODOT this morning
    - ODOT was not aware that the contractors were using that road
  - Mark got some estimates
    - If cement stabilizing; \$350,000
    - Shelly quote for motor paving International Drive; \$220,000
    - Zion Ridge Road motor paving; \$330,000
    - Paving costs have gone up by approximately 20-25%
    - Stone has also increased by \$2.50 per ton
    - Chip and seal has also increased from \$10,000 a mile to \$13,000
  - o Mark will be meeting with CVB on the 20<sup>th</sup> about help with funding
  - o International and Zion Ridge both need widened
- The Commissioners agreed on a verbal commitment for funding up to \$600,000 for International and Zion Ridge Roads
  - o Mark will continue to check with other funding sources, as well
- Mark reported that they lost a grant with OPWC this year and inflation really hurting their project funds
- They replaced 15 bridges last year and 12 this year
- Mark reported that they have not yet got funding for Wills Creek
  - o Approximately \$450,000
